

STUDENT DRESS CODE / UNIFORM REQUIREMENTS

Pacific Paradise State School is a uniform school and we encourage each and every student to take pride in themselves and their school.

Consistent dress standards establish positive and united school community identity.

Pacific Paradise P&C Association supports the schools' Student Dress Standards which has been developed in accordance with the relevant legislation, both State and Commonwealth.



THE SCHOOL UNIFORM

It is an expectation upon enrolment at Pacific Paradise State School that parents and students will consent to uphold our Student Dress Standards by way of signing the electronic Enrolment Agreement Form. At Pacific Paradise State School, the expectation is that each day students will wear the school uniform.

WHAT IS OUR UNIFORM?

FOR BOYS: A jade green polo shirt with the school logo or Sports polo in the colour of the students sporting house with school logo. Navy blue shorts. White short socks. Black closed in shoes or joggers. A navy-blue bucket hat with the school logo.

FOR GIRLS: A jade green polo shirt with the school logo or Sports polo in the colour of the students sporting house with school logo. Navy blue shorts, skirt or skorts. White short socks. Black closed in shoes or joggers. A navy-blue bucket hat with the school logo.

YEAR 6 STUDENTS: Only year 6 students are permitted to wear senior student polo shirts as a symbol of their role as positive role models and senior student representatives of our school.

WINTER ADDITIONS

Our school jacket with the school logo or a plain navy-blue jumper or jacket. Navy blue track pants or leggings. Navy beanie in the coolest months. No offensive slogans or logos will be permitted.



HATS

In accordance with Cancer Council guidelines, children must wear broad brimmed school hats when outside. The school has a "NO HAT – NO PLAY" policy in effect to restrict exposure to the sun.

HAIRSTYLES

Hair needs to be neat, clean and tidy. For both Male and Female students' hair that is shoulder length or longer needs to be tied up for safety and health reasons, (Head lice). Hair accessories are to match the school uniform and only to be navy-blue, Jade green or white. Hair colour should not be changed by the use of dyes/ bleaches etc.



JEWELLERY

Minimal jewellery is permitted for health and safety reasons and to prevent the loss or damage of expensive and or sentimental items. Students are permitted to wear:

- ✓ 1 x watch (without camera or recording capabilities)
- ✓ 1 x pair of stud or sleeper earrings.
- ✓ Medi Alert jewellery where appropriate

FINGERNAILS

Are to be neat, clean and tidy. For health and safety reasons whether natural or artificial, fingernails are not to be of a length exceeding the tip of the finger and must not be shaped to a point. Nail polish is only to be clear. Students requiring nail colour and length contrary to this for a special occasion are to carry a letter of explanation from their parent or carer, and return their nail length and colour to the safe length and colour as outlined above immediately after the special occasion.

NOT RECOMMENDED ITEMS

- * More than 1 pair of sleepers or stud earrings
- * Earrings that are larger than sleepers or studs
- × Necklaces, bangles or rings
- Hair accessories not of the school uniform colours
- ✗ Tank tops/ singlet tops
- * Board shorts unless plain navy blue
- × Make up
- ✗ Thongs or Sandals
- * Clothes with words or messages that may offend (this includes free dress day clothing).

AVAILABILITY

The P&C Association oversees the sale of shirts, shorts (unisex shorts), skorts, hats and jackets. The Uniform Shop is open Monday 8:15am – 9:15am and Thursdays 2:15 – 3:15pm. Any changes to these times are published in the school newsletter.

LOST PROPERTY

Given the enormous amount of 'Lost Property' that is found each year, we recommend that all students' clothing items are clearly labelled with their name.

CONCERNS

If students come to school dressed in an inappropriate manner i.e., their clothing or appearance could be seen as:

- a) Offensive
- b) Likely to disrupt, or negatively effect the normal operation of the school
- c) Unsafe for the student or others or
- d) Likely to result in a risk to the health of students and others,

The student will be required to remove the offensive or unsafe item and where appropriate will be provided with an alternate that adheres to the Pacific Paradise State Schools Student Dress Standards.

Repeat offenders will be required to remain at the office until their parent/guardians are contacted to discuss the matter.

Please support our efforts to promote a good image for our school in the local and wider community by following these Dress Standard Guidelines.

STUDENT DRESS STANDARDS AGREEMENT

I agree to follow the Student Dress Standards of Pacific Paradise State School by ensuring my child wears appropriate clothing, as outlined in the Pacific Paradise State School Student Dress Standards.
